## The World Isn't Ending...

**Or is it?** Over the last three weeks, we've seen the two major political parties hold their conventions and formally nominate their candidates. To say that this presidential race is unprecedented is an understatement. Even to those individuals who don't normally pay attention to politics, the fever, language and candidates themselves are attracting all kinds of attention. To those who do stay current on the political scene, it's not a stretch to say that both major candidates have serious flaws and moral deficiencies. The problems are so serious that many who once identified with a certain party are either considering sitting it out in November or writing in a candidate. Prognosticators have opined that if either of these candidates are elected, our county is going to be in serious trouble. There's even credible data that has many voters being willing to undergo physical harm as opposed to voting for either candidate. Regardless of who wins, could this election usher in the end of the world?



I ask that with a hint of sarcasm, but also with a real sense of concern with where our nation has been heading. If the world is coming to an end, I don't think it will be this election that does it. Likewise, if we're to make a return to God (as a people), I don't see it being a presidential figure or party who leads us there. So where does this election leave us?

Much like the choice between the Republican or the Democrat candidate, I think there are two choices. We can either spend from now until election day (and possibly longer) fretting over who our new president will be. We can post statements, make arguments, unfriend people on Facebook and read the news with such anger and frustration that life itself is a irritating. Or, we can do something different. After spending some time away recently, and rather than focusing on the world and more specifically this election, I'm choosing to focus on some other things:

- 1) **My faith.** I'm going to choose to believe the words of Jesus in John 14:27, *Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.* My heart is troubled when I look at this world, but my heart is never troubled when I look to Christ. If I am dependent on a candidate making this world right, I've really lost track of where my faith should be.
- 2) **My family.** My kids get only one dad. My wife has only one husband. I don't want them to see a dad or a husband that's perpetually angry at things they don't understand. While righteous anger has its place, it's important to separate what's righteous vs. what I want/prefer. I would much rather find my joy in my children and wife as opposed to the latest polls and who said what.
- 3) **My church.** It's easy for a community of faith to take the backburner to work, play, travel and general apathy. Many people in our community have no sense of real belonging and when they look at where much of their identity is placed (politics), their not so sure they can even identify with that anymore. The Bible tells us that our citizenship isn't here. I want to focus on where my citizenship ultimately lies—and who will be there with me.
- 4) **My friends.** God has made us for relationships and the enemy wants nothing more than to sow confusion and division among those relationships. Do you see that happening in this election cycle? If we're honest, we have to decide whether we value our friends (and other people) above their political affiliations. And vice versa. When it came to Jesus choosing us over our problems and hang-ups, He ALWAYS chooses us!

No matter what side your taking this election, there will be things to be angry about. But there is so much more to take joy in. It really comes down to a choice. Choose wisely.

## Chest of Joash | September 25th

Ever since Northside started back in 2002, we've had a yearly focus on stewardship. We don't use the word "steward" very much in our society, but the principle is that for everything we're given, we operate as managers or stewards, not owners.

The Chest of Joash stewardship campaign is the only time during the year that we talk about money and the church.

The Chest of Joash stewardship month is a four week teaching series on biblical giving. It concludes on Chest of Joash Sunday when we ask all those who are partners and who regularly attend Northside to consider giving a gift above and beyond their normal level of giving.



Over the years, the annual giving on Chest of Joash Sunday has allowed us to move into our first permanent space on First Avenue and complete landscaping requirements before we received our Certificate of Occupancy. Last year, over \$30,000.00 was given on Chest of Joash Sunday to install sump pumps in the Lower Level and replace our HVAC system.

This year will be no different. Gifts given on Chest of Joash Sunday will be used to accomplish three very important tasks:

1. Pave the Second Avenue parking lot (completed in May with anticipated Chest of Joash funds) \$14,000.00
2. Install new projector in sanctuary and display board for praise team \$8,000.00
3. Repair Lower Level walls (sealing, wall repair, baseboard, paint) \$15,000.00

From initial conversations and proposals we have received, we're estimating that the costs will total approximately \$40,000.00 to accomplish these tasks. Please begin praying now about how God might have you to be involved on Chest of Joash Sunday on September 25th.

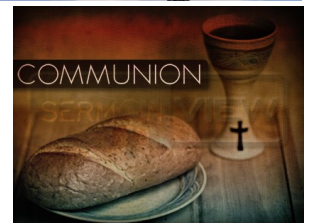
## Adopt A Highway

We'll be observing Holy Communion during the 9:00 and 10:45 am services. We're never more united as a church body than when we participate in the Lord's Table.



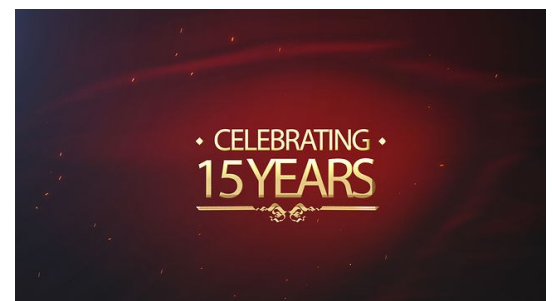
## Elder / Deacon Selection

3. The church has contracted with Dalton Engineering to do a preliminary site plan for future building additions on the First Avenue property.

5. The Church leadership will be working through a ministry strategic plan beginning in March/April 2017.
6. Plans are underway for a mission trip in July 2017 to minister to the Navaho Indian Tribe in Arizona.
